Program Note:

The title, como los que sueñan ["like those who dream"] and conceptual ideas are taken from the the ancient paradoxical Jewish poetry of Psalm 126. On the surface, this psalm seems to be about thankful, even joyful, remembrance. However, these memories devolve into an existencial petition. The psalmist desperately desires a return to a healthier, safer time, but does not surrender to despair. This kind of quiet perseverance challenges modern notions of control and instant gratification. It was my aim to musically explore such resilience; this work concludes with a quote from Brahms's German Requiem, a melodic fragment he used to set the promise in the fifth verse of this very psalm, "Those who sow with tears will reap with songs of joy."
